



Amartya Chatterjee is a historian trained at the University of Delhi (North Campus) and KU Leuven, Belgium. His Master's thesis, "From the Hooligan to the Hashtag: Student Movements in Postcolonial Kolkata," explored the social and cultural history of student politics in postcolonial Kolkata, drawing on oral histories, interviews, and archival research to trace shifts from street mobilization to digital activism.

He later pursued a second Master's degree in Architectural and Cultural Heritage at Hochschule Anhalt, Germany, where he also served for three years as a Teaching Assistant and International Student Officer.

His research interests focus on strategy, South Asian studies, and postcolonial political formations in the Indian subcontinent, particularly the relationship between political movements, statecraft, and strategic thought in modern South Asia.
